



ISLAMIC RELIEF USA | SYRIA PROJECTS: SUMMARY

Conflict began in Syria in March 2011, isolating entire towns and neighborhoods, and exposing many Syrians to daily violence. In many communities, people have been forced to remain in their homes for safety. Many others have been pushed out of their neighborhoods to try to find refuge in adjacent areas. They cannot commute to work, school and other places of business, or get supplies or medical care. This makes life unbearable for people who already have little access to food, water, medical care and electricity.

To protect their families, millions of Syrian refugees have fled to neighboring countries, such as Jordan and Lebanon. The latest reports indicate that the registered Syrian refugee population outside Syria is more than 4.4 million. In Jordan, areas such as Mafraq, Ramtha, Irbid, Zarqa, Maan, Al Karak and Amman are hosting large numbers of Syrian refugees, while in Lebanon, many Syrian refugees are being hosted in areas such as Akkar.

Unfortunately, the situation for both internal and external Syrian refugees is only expected to get worse.

More than 3.9 million Syrians, both inside Syria and in neighboring Jordan and Lebanon, have been helped by Islamic Relief USA's generous community. And, through the collaborative efforts of Islamic Relief offices around the world, many more Syrians affected by the conflict have received aid.

WINTERIZATION SUPPORT FOR INTERNALLY DISPLACED SYRIANS IN NORTHERN SYRIA

DEC. 2014 - JUNE 2015

Location: Northern Syria

This project helped to protect families from harsh winter weather in northern Syria by providing winter supplies.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Distribute the following items to internally displaced Syrians:
 - 40,000 blankets
 - 10,000 boys' coats & 10,000 girls' coats
 - 10,000 boots for boys & 10,000 boots for girls
- 10,000 sets of warm undergarments for women
- 10,000 sets of warm undergarments for men
- 4,000 mattresses and plastic sheets

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- The following items have been distributed in Aleppo, Idlib, Idlib IDP camps, Hamah and Lattakia:
 - 35,700 coats
 - 35,348 pairs of shoes
 - 31,000 warm undergarments

HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FOR SYRIANS INSIDE SYRIA VIA TURKEY

DEC. 2012 - MAY 2013

Location: Suburbs of Idlib including Maarat Al Noman area, Suburbs of Aleppo, part of Hmah suburbs, east area (Al Bkamal, Al Mayadeen, and Deir El Zoor), Atma camp, Qah camp, and Al Karama camp, and suburbs of the coastal area. Expansion of target area was contingent on the security situation.

This project provided emergency aid to Syrians in need inside of Syria through Islamic Relief partner offices in Turkey.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Food kits were distributed including: Rice, sugar, bulgar, canned kidney beans, canned white beans, lentils, zatar, olive oil, tuna cans, tahini with molasses, flour, sweets
 - Non-food item kits distributed including: Mattresses and blankets
 - Medical equipment and medicines distributed including medicines and disposable medical supplies for 42 field hospitals: Neurosurgery sets, vascular surgery sets, orthopedic surgery sets, anesthesia, portable automatic ventilator, first aid needs (stretcher, air mattress, theater instrument trolley, bed mattress), radiology needs (digital ECG, portable ultrasound, vascular Doppler device), and disposables (suction tubes of various sizes, suture silk, suture chromic, urine collecting bag, under water chest drainage bottle, gauze, IV catheter, laryngoscope blades, colostomy bag).
- Distributed 6,970 blankets, 5,000 mattresses and 5,000 food packs were distributed

PROVIDING FOOD AND NON-FOOD ASSISTANCE FOR SYRIAN FAMILIES IN NORTHWEST SYRIA

APR. 2013 - NOV. 2013

Location: Idlib, Aleppo, and Ma'arat al Nu'man

ACHIEVEMENTS: This project helped internally displaced Syrians in Syria with food and non-food item distributions including:

Food packages: Rice, red lentils, bulgur, olive oil, zatar, tuna, kidney beans, tahini, sugar, and flour



- Hygiene kits: Sanitary wipes, shampoo, hand soap, bath soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, sanitary pads, determined paper, and tissues
- Baby kits: Baby diapers, baby food, baby biscuits, milk, towels, baby shampoo, pacifier, feeding bottle, ar

THIS PROJECT HELPED 130,200 SYRIANS BY PROVIDING FOOD. BABY ITEMS AND HYGIENE KITS.



EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE FOR VULNERABLE PALESTINIANS INSIDE SYRIA

AUG. 2013 - DEC. 2013

Location: Syria

This project supported conflict-affected Palestinian refugees inside Syria to ensure they have their basic needs met. Food packets and hygiene kits were distributed to Palestinian refugees in shelters in Damascus.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Food packets distributed included: Pasta, sugar, halawa, halal canned meat, milk powder, cooking oil, rice, red lentils
- Hygiene kits distributed included: Sanitary towels and diapers

SYRIA WINTERIZATION CAMPAIGN FOR SYRIANS INSIDE SYRIA 2014

FEB. 2014 - NOV. 2014

Location: Idlib, Hama, Lattakia and Aleppo, Syria | This project helped Syrian families survive winter weather inside Syria.

PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS: Distributed the following winter supplies: 3,050 blankets, 3,300 mattresses and 2,920 plastic sheets

THIS PROJECT HELPED 27,930 INDIVIDUALS IN 64 CAMPS FOR INTERNALLY DISPLACED PEOPLE INSIDE SYRIA.

FOOD AND NON-FOOD SUPPORT INSIDE SYRIA (PHASE 2)

JAN. 2014 - AUG. 2014

Location: Northwest Syria | This project alleviated the suffering of affected people in Syria by improving hygiene conditions and food security.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Distributed 9,000 food packages, with items such as rice, red lentils, bulgur, olive oil, tuna, tomato paste, ghee, sugar, flour
- Distribution of 48,000 hygiene kits: Wet wipes, shampoo, hand soap, bath soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, sanitary pads, laundry detergent, toilet paper, tissue paper

FOOD, MEDICAL CARE, AND WATER, HEALTH AND SANITATION SUPPORT FOR SYRIANS IN SYRIA

JUNE 2013 - FEB. 2014

Location: Northwest Syria | This project alleviated the suffering of displaced Syrians inside Syria with emergency food, medical and water/sanitation interventions.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Provide food packages to internally displaced Syrians in Syria
- Provide vital medicine and medical equipment for more than 42 field hospitals in Syria
- Provide shower units, fully stocked including: toilets with private doors, sinks, mirrors and sanitary networks

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- 136 medical items provided to 105 field hospitals and 36 medical points inside Syria
- Delivered 18,600 food parcels in areas including Idlib, parts of Aleppo, Lattakia, Jabal Alakrad, Tourkman, Banyas, Northern Homs, Northwest Hama, Deir az Zour, Arragga, Alhassagua
- 13 bathrooms with showers provided for 3 camps: Alre'aya camp for elderly/handicapped; Alaqsa camp; and Alfourqan

FOOD SUPPORT FOR NEEDY FAMILIES INSIDE SYRIA

JUNE 2014 - JAN. 2015

Location: Syria | This project aimed to ensure that Syrian families inside Syria have food to eat despite increasing food scarcity.

PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Distributed monthly food packages that typically contain the following staple foods: rice, bulgur, lentils, olive oil, cooking oil, olives, ghee, tomato paste, sugar, jam, canned tuna fish and flour
 - 32,944 food parcels were distributed
 - 30,777 bags of flour were distributed

MEDICAL AND WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE SUPPORT

JUNE 2014 - JAN. 2015

Location: Syria | This project aims to support medical field clinics with medical supplies and provide hygiene and sanitation stations inside Syria.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Support 35 medical points and field hospitals with adequate medical supplies
- Install 23 water, hygiene and sanitation units with five latrines and two showers each in camps

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO DISPLACEMENT

OCT. 2015 - DEC. 2015

Location: Aleppo, Idlib | This project aims to increase the food security of recently displaced people inside Syria.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

Provide 10,000 households with food parcels designed to meet their dietary needs for at least one month.

THIS PROJECT WILL HELP AN ESTIMATED 50,000 INTERNALLY DISPLACED SYRIANS.

WINTERIZATION PROJECT FOR SYRIA

OCT. 2015 - MAY 2016

Location: Aleppo, Idlib, Hama, Lattakia | This project aims to provide winterization items to Syrians inside Syria.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Distribute the following items to Syrians in need:
 - 286 tents
 - 5,400 new mattresses
 - 10,400 plastic sheets
 - 18,599 blankets

THIS PROJECT WILL HELP AT LEAST 76,200 SYRIANS.

HELPING CONFLICT AFFECTED PALESTINIAN FAMILIES IN SYRIA COPE THROUGH THE WINTER

DEC. 2015 - MAY 2016

Location: Yalda, Babila, Beit Saham, Khan Esheih and parts of Dera'a | This project aims to project newly displaced Palestinian refugees in Syria with blankets and mattresses to help them deal with the harsh winter weather.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

Provide blankets and mattresses to Palestinians displaced by conflict in Syria.

THIS PROJECT WILL HELP INTERNALLY DISPLACED PALESTINIANS IN SYRIA AT SHELTERS MANAGED BY UNRWA.

WASH SUPPORT FOR THE NEEDY, VULNERABLE SYRIAN COMMUNITY

NOV. 2015 - SEPT. 2016

Location: Aleppo, Idlib, Hama, Lattakia | This project aims to provide water and sanitation support to Syrians inside Syria at IDP camps.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Distribute hygiene kits containing shampoo, disinfectant, toothpast, toothbrushes, washing powder, toilet paper, sanitary pads, towels, a comp and hand washing soap.
- Install 36 WASH containers (each container includes 5 toilets, 2 showers and 4 sinks).
- Distribute hygiene awareness material (information, education and communication material).

FOOD ASSISTANCE FOR VULNERABLE SYRIAN FAMILIES

MAY 2015 - MAR. 2016

Location: Northern Syria (Aleppo, Halab, Lattakia and Hamah as security permits) This project aims to provide families inside Syria with food aid.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

Syrians will receive food packages containing the following: rice, bulgur, lentils, olive oil, ghee, tomato paste, sugar, jam, tuna, soya oil, halawa, olives and flour (contents may change based on needs)

THIS PROJECT WILL HELP 92,100 SYRIANS.

FOOD AND SUPPLIES FOR DISPLACED SYRIANS IN NORTHERN SYRIA THROUGH WINTER

JAN. 2015 - SEPT. 2015

Location: northern Syria | This project aims to prepare displaced Syrian families inside Syria for winter weather

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Distribute the following items to support families during the winter:
 - 350 tents
 - 7,500 mattresses
 - 7,500 plastic sheets
 - 8,500 blankets
 - 8,500 food parcels



URGENT WINTERIZATION SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE SYRIANS AND HOST COMMUNITY, JORDAN

JAN. 2015 - APR. 2015

Location: Irbid, Ramtha, Mafraq | This project aims to help Syrian refugees in Jordan through the winter.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Distribute the following winterization items:
 - 3,577 clothing vouchers
 - gas heaters and fuel vouchers for 450 families
 - blankets for 666 families

THIS PROJECT WILL HELP AN ESTIMATED 7,580 PEOPLE.

URGENT ASSISTANCE TO SYRIAN REFUGEE FAMILIES IN JORDAN, PHASE 1

DEC. 2011 - MAY 2012

Location: Maan, Zarqa, Mafraq, Amman, Ramtha, and Irbid, Jordan This project helped Syrian refugee families in Jordan meet their basic needs with the distribution of food items, non-food items, winter items, and provision of housing rent.



ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Food packets distributed included: Rice, sugar, cooking oil, pasta, powdered milk, beans, salt, tomato paste, feta cheese, chicken stock, lentils, and canned meat
- Hygiene kits distributed included:
- Shampoo, soap, sanitary napkins, clorox, laundry detergent, dishwashing soap, facial tissue, toothpaste, and baby diapers
- Winter items distributed included: Fuel for heating and cooking
- Shelter provided: Housing rent support given to families

2147 people were helped total with these project activities.

URGENT ASSISTANCE TO SYRIAN REFUGEE FAMILIES IN JORDAN, PHASE 2

JUNE 2012 - JAN. 2013

Location: Mafraq, Amman, Ramtha, Jordan

This project helped Syrian refugee families in Jordan meet their basic needs with eight distributions of food items and non-food items, medical care, and provision of housing rent.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Food packets distributed included: Rice, sugar, cooking oil, pasta, powdered milk, beans, salt, tomato paste, cheese, and chicken stock
- Hygiene kits distributed included: Shampoo, soap, sanitary napkins, clorox, laundry detergent, liquid soap, facial issue, toothpaste and baby diapers
- Winter item kits distributed included: Heater, pillow, matress, and blanket
- Shelter provided: Housing rent support given to families
- Medical care provided: Medicine supplied to Akilah hospital for Syrian patients
- 600 Syrian refugee families provided with housing rent
- 600 food parcels were distributed

600 non-food item kits were distributed

439 winter kits were distributed

EMERGENCY SUPPLIES FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES IN ZATAARI REFUGEE CAMP

FEB. 2013

Location: Zaatari refugee camp, Jordan

Five, forty-foot containers of emergency relief supplies were delivered to and distributed in Zataari refugee camp in Jordan.

The containers contained the following items for distribution:

CONTAINER 1

- 12 pallets of powdered milk (24,000 lbs)
- 4 pallets of hygiene kits (4,480 kits)

CONTAINER 2

• 20 pallets of blankets (9,600 blankets)

CONTAINER 3

- 12 pallets of winter boots (2,760 pairs)
- 8 pallets of shoes (2,160 pairs)

CONTAINER 4

- 4 pallets of shoes (1080 pairs)
- 8 pallets of school kits (3,360 kits)
- 144 bundles of coats (5,760 coats)

CONTAINER 5

• 375 bundles of coats (15,000 coats)

HOSPITALIZATION ASSISTANCE FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES IN JORDAN

AUG. 2012 - APR. 2013

This project helped provide urgent inpatient care for Syrian refugees in Jordan. Patients included men, women and children with injuries suffered in Syria related to violence during political unrest. Patients were treated at four hospitals in Jordan: the Specialist Hospital in Amman, the Specialist Hospital in Irbid, the Islamic Hospital in Amman, and Akilah Hospital in Amman.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

160 PATIENTS WERE TREATED WITH EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE SERVICES.

SUPPORT THE WOUNDED SYRIANS IN JORDAN

MAY 2013 - JUNE 2013 | Location: Amman, Jordan

This project helped provide vital medical treatment for Syrian refugees in Jordan through al-Salaam Hospital in Amman.

PRIMARY HEALTH CARE FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES IN JORDAN AKILAH HOSPITAL

APR. 2013 - OCT. 2013 | Location: Amman, Jordan

This project helped to provide surgeries and outpatient medical care to Syrian refugees at the Akilah Hospital in Amman, Jordan.

THIS PROJECT PROVIDED 12,507 PEOPLE WITH HEALTH CARE SERVICES.

LIFE-SAVING HEALTH ASSISTANCE FOR VULNERABLE SYRIAN AND JORDANIAN FAMILIES AFFECTED BY SYRIA HUMANITARIAN CRISIS

JAN. 2014 - DEC. 2014 | Location: Irbid, Amman, Mafrag

This project aims to to assist 3,800 individuals (80% Syrian refugees and 20% poor Jordanians) with medical treatment through a network of four hospitals (Aqilah, Dar al Salam, Lozmillah and Ibn Nafs). Services provided may include primary care, orthopedics, ENT, psychiatry and urology, as well as surgeries, lab testing, X-ray imaging and outpatient care.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

8,328 people were provided secondary and tertiary medical services.

URGENT WINTERIZATION SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE SYRIANS & JORDANIAN HOST COMMUNITY 2014

FEB. 2014 - AUG. 2014 | Location: Irbid, Mafraq, Baqa'a This project aimed to help Syrian refugees and their host families through the winter

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- 559 families received carpets
- 381 families received carpets and blankets
- 275 families received hygiene kits (baby diapers, shampoo, soap, ladies pads, liquid bleach, laundry soap, dish liquid soap, wet wipes, toothpaste, dish washing sponge)

At least 75% of the families reported that they were in dire need of winterization item; 17% of the families were vulnerable Jordanian families.

URGENT WINTERIZATION ASSISTANCE FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES AND VULNERABLE JORDANIAN FAMILIES IN JORDAN (PENDING)

JAN. 2016- JUNE 2016

This project aims to provide winter items to Syrian refugees and Jordanian families in need in Jordan.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

• Provide waterproof sheeting, clothing vouchers, heaters, blankets and winterization health kits (includes vitamins, and medicine for common winter colds).

THIS PROJECT WILL HELP AN ESTIMATED 9,900 PEOPLE.

LIFE-SAVING HEALTH ASSISTANCE FOR VULNERABLE SYRIAN FAMILIES, PHASE 3

JAN. 2015 - OCTOBER 2015 | Location: Amman, Irbid, Zarqa

This project aims to provide life-saving medical assistance and health awareness to Syrian refugees and host communities in Jordan.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- Provide regular hemodialysis treatment and medication to 10 patients.
- Increase access to primary health care to the community through mobile clinics.
- Conduct health awareness campaigns targeting both Syrian refugees and host communities on personal hygiene, disease prevention, vaccination and more.



SUPPORTING DISPLACED SYRIANS IN LEBANON—WINTERIZATION

FEB. 2014 - JUNE 2014

Location: Bekaa, Mount Lebanon and South of Lebanon

This project aims to increase the ability of 800 families (4,800 individuals) to cope with severe winter conditions over 4 months by distributing blankets, heaters, fuel, mattresses, protection sets, carpets, baby kits, food parcels and hygiene kits.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

• 24,214 individuals (4,777 families) received winterization items, baby kits and food parcels. A larger number of individuals were reached due to coordination efforts with other UN/NGO entities by the IR-Lebanon team.

MORE THAN 24,000 PEOPLE WERE HELPED WITH THESE PROJECT ACTIVITIES.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES IN LEBANON

MAY 2011 - DEC. 2011

Location: Wadi Khaled and Draib Area - Akkar, North Lebanon

This project supported Syrian refugees and host families in Lebanon through four distributions. These distributions helped meet the food, hygiene and medical needs of the refugees and their host families. Items provided included food kits, water, bread packs, hygiene kits, blankets, baby kits, clothing for youth, and diapers.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- 1453 food kits were distributed
- 775 hygiene kits were distributed
- 375 water containers (20 liters of water each) were delivered
- 375 bread packs were delivered

- 40 baby kits were delivered
- 31 clothing kits for youth were delivered
- 1502 diaper packages were delivered
- 1200 blankets were delivered

SUPPORTING SYRIAN REFUGEES IN LEBANON WITH FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS

JAN. 2013 - JULY 2013

Location: Northern Casa Akkar (Wadi Khaled village), Bekaa Casa (Faour, Barelyas, and Saadnayel villages), Southern Casa (Saida City), and Mount Lebanon Casa (Ketermaya, Barja, and Chheem villages), Lebanon

This project helped provide food and non-food items and vital medicine to Syrian refugees and their host families in Lebanon.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Food kits were distributed including:
 - Rice, white sugar, red lentils, macaroni, noodles, coarse grits, sunflower oil, beans, chickpeas, tomato sauce, halal deli meat, salt, margarine, tea, and bread
- Hygiene kits distributed including:
 - Shampoo, liquid soap, dish cleaning liquid, cdisinfectant wipes, toels, bathroom tissues, sanitary pads, and laundry detergent
- Baby kits distributed including:
 - Diaper bag, body wrap, baby towel, small napkins, bib, undergarments, baby clothing, baby shampoo, baby soap, baby powder, changing pads, and pillow
- Other items distributed including:
 - Mattresses, kitchen sets, blankets, medicine, carpet, candles, water, winter blankets and anti-mosquito repellant
- Sick and injured patients were treated with medicine and hospitalization
