SUDAN EMERGENCY

It's been one year since violence erupted in Sudan as rival factions fought for control of the country's capital. Civilians are still bearing the brunt of the fighting as it spreads across the country. A staggering 8.4 million people have been forcibly displaced, facing high levels of food insecurity and outbreaks of disease including dengue fever, cholera, and measles. A total of 24.8 million men, women, and children are in dire need of humanitarian assistance.

Outcome #3: Access to clean water and sanitation through construction and rehabilitation of 12 boreholes and formation of six water resource management committees

OVERVIEW

IRUSA is working to help orphan families break the cycle of poverty through access to basic needs and sustainable livelihood efforts.

PROGRESS

Outcome #1: Providing orphan families with improved food security and access to basic services including clean water, education, and healthcare

- 400 rightsholders have been provided with food vouchers
- 190 children have been provided with access to education
- 400 rightsholders have been provided with access to healthcare including three mosquito nets per family

Outcome #2: Promoting social inclusion and providing financial literacy training

- 200 participants have completed social inclusion trainings
- 200 participants have completed financial literacy trainings

Outcome #3: Sustainable livelihood efforts including helping families diversify their income

- 200 participants have completed social inclusion trainings
- 200 participants have completed financial literacy trainings
- 400 participants have completed technical skills training
- 200 participants have completed business skills training
