In September 2023, heavy rainfall brought by Storm Daniel caused major flooding in Derna, Libya. Thousands of people were killed and entire neighborhoods were swept away, leaving thousands more displaced. In response, Islamic Relief USA worked with local partners to provide immediate emergency aid including food and essential non-food items to families in need. To this day, we continue to focus on long-term development aid.



The goal of this project is to improve access to primary healthcare for flood-affected people across Libya as well as promote safeguarding for vulnerable women and children.
