

LETTER FROM IRUSA CEO

Assalamu alaikum.

As the Chief Executive Officer of Islamic Relief USA (IRUSA), the largest Muslim faith-based nonprofit organization in the United States, and one of the largest in the world, I want to sincerely thank all of our donors, volunteers, staff, and partners. Because of your efforts, we were able to support 5,444,975 people across 42 countries in 2023.

Throughout 2023, our hearts were one with those affected by poverty and forced displacement at the hands of natural disasters and man-made devastation. It is absolutely heartbreaking how many people across how many countries needed emergency response, but, through your support and compassion, we were able to provide that critical aid to families in places like Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Kenya, Libya, Morocco, Pakistan, Palestine, the Philippines, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, and Ukraine.

And thanks to you, we helped curb food insecurity in the US and abroad by providing 509,882 Ramadan food boxes and 978,380 people with Qurbani meat.

We invested more than \$120 million in international and domestic aid through 553 global and US projects across eight sectors; education; emergency response; food security and livelihood; health and nutrition; orphan sponsorship and support; water, sanitation, and hygiene; community development; and refugee and immigrant services.

Our IRUSAdvocates also inspired change with 25,988 actions taken around refugees, food security, and climate change.

None of this would have been possible without you. As your CEO, I hope that together, we can change the global environment until every individual we serve no longer needs assistance. May Allah (SWT) reward all our efforts.



Methodology and Sources

The overall financial figures in this report were drawn from our 2023 audited financial statements or 2023 IRS Form 990. Detailed country financial data was drawn from grant records and reports from the implementing party in the field. The 42 countries mentioned on this page include the US. Estimates of total people served are based on project reports from the implementing party in the field or other quantifiable data sources. The total is calculated by including any participant who received aid in 2023 through an IRUSA-funded project or Gifts-in-Kind aid. For projects funded and implemented over several years, it is possible for the same participant to receive aid over several years, and thus be included more than once. In this circumstance, we count that person once per calendar year. A person of multiple projects may be counted more than once. Efforts towards eliminating this in future reports are in motion.

Programs Commitment Statement


At IRUSA our goal is to deliver top-notch programs. Our grants extend beyond the surface numbers you see — they're multi-year commitments aimed at ensuring proper implementation and reporting. In 2023, our total commitment hit \$233,988,946. We've already disbursed \$121,482,794 from that commitment, leaving \$112,506,152 yet to be distributed.

This structured disbursement methodology quarantees precise project execution while adhering to rigorous reporting standards. At IRUSA, fund disbursement for multi-year programs is divided across several payments that occur over the lifetime of the project — the full amount is deliberately not dispersed all upfront to ensure proper implementation, progress, and reporting. IRUSA releases subsequent payments to the grantees based on the compliance of program requirements, proper spending, and the delivery of corresponding reports, among other things.

Our unwavering commitment to project excellence is integral to our values. Our Monitoring and Evaluation team conducts ongoing assessments, ensuring the success and meaningful impact of our projects.

In 2023, IRUSA's DMT helped 30 families in the aftermath of Hurricane Idalia in Florida by providing 500 flood buckets packed with essential cleaning supplies.

They also continued long-term disaster response efforts for 70 families in Puerto Rico affected by Hurricane Fiona's devastation through constructing flood shelves to enhance resilience against future flooding.

And finally, after facing repeated devastation from Atlantic storms, nine families and one dorm center in North Carolina received aid through the help of volunteers and funding.
