

PROJECT IMPACT

It's been more than one year since violence erupted in Sudan as rival factions fought for control of the country's capital. Civilians are still bearing the brunt of the fighting as it spreads across the country. With more than half of the population – around 25 million people – suffering from hunger, the country faces the worst levels of acute food insecurity in its history. To add, over 10 million people, or every fifth person, has been forcibly displaced both internally and into neighboring countries. EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR SUDAN CRISIS (EMRES)

IRUSA is working to provide immediate emergency aid to vulnerable communities across the Gedaref, North Kordofan, and Red Sea states in Sudan.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES

Delivering aid such as fuel, food, water, health aid, and more.

PROGRESS

- Distributed 50 barrels of fuel in Gedaref
- Distributed unconditional cash assistance to 600 families including 300 in Port Sudan/Red
 Sea and 300 in Gedaref
- Distributed 176 food packs for patients, including those on kidney dialysis, in seven hospitals (two in North Kordofan, three in Al Jazirah, and three in Gedaref)
- Distributed 500 hygiene kits to families in in need including 250 in Gedaref and 250 kits in North Kordofan
- Distributed 454 water storage buckets to flood-affected families in Arbaat/Red Sea
- Distributed 876 plastic sheets for temporary shelter including 150 in North Kordofan, 120 in Gedaref, and 106 in Port Sudan
- · Conducted five hygiene awareness sessions for 17,550 people
- Distributed 17,550 soaps to people in need including 9,000 in Gaderef and 8,550 in North Kordofan
- Distributed 310 essential non-food items to flood-affected people including 185 in Arbaat /
 Red Sea and 125 in Gedaref
- Conducted 18 psychosocial sessions including 11 in Gedaref, five in North Kordofan, and two in Port Sudan
- Distribution of recreational material to 1,126 children including 1,000 in North Kordofan and 126 in Gedaref
