



OVERVIEW

After two years of continued violence in Gaza, over half a million people now face catastrophic levels of starvation and another 1 million people are facing emergency levels of hunger, according to the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC). Thanks to donors like you, IRUSA is working to provide vital food aid to families in need.

CURRENT PROJECTS

FOOD PARCELS AND HOT MEALS FOR INTERNALLY DISPLACED FAMILIES

Project cost: \$2,500,000

Timeline: Aug. 2025 to Mar. 2026 Proposed people served: 187,563

Planned Activities:

- Distribute food parcels to 11,375 internally displaced families
- Distribute 50,000 hot meals to 125,000 internally displaced people

QURBANI 2025

Project cost: \$1,000,000

Timeline: Distributions began June 2025

Proposed people served: 147,000

Due to blockades, food parcels originally intended for Gaza are being rerouted to the West Bank. So far, we've distributed meat parcels to **35,140** people, and we're working to distribute the remaining meat parcels to another **117,600** people.

OVERVIEW

Gaza's health system has been steadily unraveling before our eyes, deteriorating with each passing year — 60% of primary healthcare centers and 50% of hospitals have completely shut down, with most of those remaining only partially functional. Doctors are overwhelmed, patients go untreated, and entire communities lack access to even the most basic medical care. Thanks to your support, IRUSA is working to provide proper healthcare to people in need.

CURRENT PROJECTS

SCALING LIFESAVING MATERNAL CARE THROUGH TRAINING, SUPPLIES, AND YOUTH-LED CHANGE IN GAZA

Project cost: \$1,000,000

Timeline: Aug. 2025 to June 2026 Proposed people served: 2,984

Planned Activities:

- Distribute 1,157 postpartum kits
- Support the graduation of 20 midwifery students
- Train 50 midwives
- Implement 50 youth-led initiatives on women's health and gender-based violence


HEARING TREATMENT IN GAZA

Project cost: \$370,000

Timeline: Feb. 2025 to Oct. 2025 Proposed people served: 500

Planned Activities:

IRUSA is working to improve access to high-quality hearing treatment for underserved communities across Gaza. The goal is to distribute 1,000 hearing aids (two per patient) to 500 children and adults with hearing loss.



ENHANCING REHABILITATION SERVICES FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES IN THE WEST BANK AND GAZA

Project cost: \$505,003

Timeline: Jan. 2025 to Mar. 2026 **Proposed people served:** 728

Planned Activities:

- Conduct 16 trainings focused on improving clinical practices
- Conduct 160 clinical assessments and referrals for children across four centers
- Expand autism services by equipping and training staff in two centers
- Establish a satellite rehabilitation unit at Al-Ahli Hospital staffed by four local professionals (physiotherapist, occupational therapist, pediatric doctor, and social worker), benefitting at least 100 children and their families annually
- Deliver tele-medicine follow-up for 100 children



EMERGENCY SUPPORT FOR AL-AHLI ARAB HOSPITAL

Project cost: \$1,601,538

Timeline: Dec. 2024 to Feb. 2026 Proposed people served: 7,275

Planned Activities:

- Provide essential healthcare services to 7,200 people
- Provide 12,200 treatments to patients
- Hire 75 staff

AGENTS OF HOPE: GAZA YOUTH RESILIENCE PROJECT

Project cost: \$999,974

Timeline: Nov. 2024 to Jan. 2027

Proposed people served: 685 [Direct], 75,000

(Indirect)

Planned Activities:

- Train 150 youth in physiotherapy and enroll 90 graduates in a two month internship to apply their skills in humanitarian efforts
- Train 120 midwives
- Train 60 youth to provide CPR, bandaging, and other emergency skills
- Train 120 youth to provide emergency psychological support
- Provide 100 youth with help to rebuild their business, psychosocial training, and recovery toolkits and enroll 60 youth entrepreneurs in a 36-hour training to develop their business plans






FORTIFYING THE PALESTINIAN MEDICAL SECTOR PHASE III

Project cost: \$7,675,000

Timeline: Oct. 2024 to Dec. 2026 Proposed people served: 420,204

Planned Activities:

- Enhance NGO hospital and primary health services via facility repairs/improvements and equipment procurements
- Support the provision of limb prosthetics and assistive devices to amputees and severely injured people
- Expand the provision of primary healthcare services across 13 Bedouin communities by activating mobile medical teams [MMTs]
- Enhance emergency preparedness in 12 West Bank communities by providing community members with first aid training, emergency first aid kits, and medical supplies
- Enable hospitals, primary healthcare clinics, and emergency care providers to provide patients with quality health services including pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, and lab reagents



HYGIENE KITS FOR GAZA

Project cost: \$500,000

Timeline: Oct. 2024 to Feb. 2026 Proposed people served: 40,000

Planned Activities:

Provide 6,000 hygiene kits





ENHANCING HEALTHCARE SERVICES IN GAZA THROUGH MEDICAL MISSIONS

Project cost: \$596,253

Timeline: July 2024 to Mar. 2026 Proposed people served: 9,594

Milestones:

- Provided 317,476 medical supplies including medicine to Al-Shifa Hospital
- Provided medical services to 9,594 patients
- · Conducted 5,437 dialysis
- Trained 50 healthcare workers

HOPE & HEALING IN GAZA

Project cost: \$2,600,000

Timeline: Jan. 2024 to Mar. 2026

Proposed people served: 237,980 [Direct],

475,960 (Indirect)

Progress:

- Provided 437 hygiene kits
- Provided food parcels to 4,335 families
- Conducted 7,448 self-care workshops for 163,924 people
- Formed 767 intensive mind-body skills groups for 7,642 people
- Provided individual psychosocial support activities via phone/text for 35,333 people
- Conducted psychosocial support activities via social and multimedia for 25,862 people
- Conducted 76 recreational workshops for 44,040 people

CURRENT PROJECTS

EMERGENCY SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE FAMILIES IN GAZA

Project cost: \$2,000,000

Timeline: June 2025 to Dec. 2025 Proposed people served: 13,800

Planned Activities:

- Provide emergency shelter to 2,000 internally displaced families
- Connect 300 people with Cash for Work opportunities



EMERGENCY CASH ASSISTANCE FOR INTERNALLY DISPLACED FAMILIES IN THE WEST BANK

Project cost: \$260,000

Timeline: May 2025 to Nov. 2025 **Proposed people served:** 1,750

Planned Activities:

Provide cash assistance to 350 internally displaced families

ACCESS TO PROPER WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH) SERVICES IN GAZA

Project cost: \$1,000,000

Timeline: Oct. 2024 to Jan. 2026 Proposed people served: 40,000

Planned Activities:

- Provide access to clean drinking water through water trucking
- Provide access to latrines with a communitybased waste management system
- Distribute essential non-food items (NFIs) including soap

WeCan 4.0 (WEST BANK)

Project cost: \$2,400,000

Timeline: Sept. 2024 to Nov. 2028 Proposed people served: 440

Planned Activities:

- Conduct 900 personalized coaching and mentoring sessions
- Provide technical, social, and business training for 310 people
- Conduct 160 hours of e-marketing training
- Provide vocational training for 20 people
- Conduct eight team-building and networking sessions

HOUSEHOLD NEEDS FOR VULNERABLE FAMILIES IN GAZA

Project cost: \$6,271,252

Timeline: Nov. 2023 to Dec. 2025 Proposed people served: 78,670

Progress:

- Distributed tents to 10,475 people
- Provided bedding kits to 10,134 people
- Provided gender-sensitive hygiene kits to 5,360 people





ACCESS TO BASIC NEEDS FOR VULNERABLE PEOPLE IN GAZA

Project cost: \$8,100,000

Timeline: Oct. 2023 to Jan. 2026 Proposed people served: 1,278,932

Progress:

- Provided access to medical care including psychosocial support for 405,143 internally displaced people through three mobile medical clinics
- Provided medical items to eight hospitals
- Psychosocial support including recreational activities and theater training for 22,814 adults and children
- Provided gender-sensitive hygiene kits to 16,536 people
- Provided food parcels to 235,616 people during Ramadan
- Distributed 31,000,000 liters of clean water
- Provided adequate clothing for 19,950 people
- Provided 62,600 individual meals and 39,066 family meals during Ramadan
